A Letter from the Township Manager

In 2023 the Township Board of Supervisors approved a budget with no tax increase for the 10th consecutive year keeping the milage at 2.74 with .2 mils dedicated to public safety. Also, the Township's earned income tax rate remains unchanged at 1%.

In 2023 the Township's primary sources of revenue, which is consistent with prior years, continues to come from the Real Estate Tax and Act 511 Taxes. The Act 511 Taxes are: Earned Income, Admission, Local Service, Per Capita, Real Estate Transfer, and Mechanical Amusement Device. These two revenue categories make up 82.7% of the total revenue in the township budget. The remaining 17.3% of revenue comes from categories of Interest, Licenses and Permits, Fines, Rental Income, Intergovernmental Receipts, Departmental Fees, and Miscellaneous Revenues.

In 2023 the General Fund revenues were budgeted at \$17,700,779, which is a 6.7% increase over the 2022 budget. Notable changes in the General Fund revenue include increases in Real Estate Transfer Tax, Sales Tax, and Building Permit Fees. Once the 2022 audit is finalized, the General Fund is projected to end the year with an unassigned fund balance of approximately \$1.1 million.

Now, my guess is, you are questioning where all the money goes. The General Fund operating expenditures are projected to be \$17,511,600, which is a 0.5% increase over the 2022 budget. The Township's two largest departments are the Moon Township Police Department and the Moon Township Public Works Department. These departments combined represent 52% of the General Fund budget. Of the remaining 48%, 10% is allocated to long-term debt, and the remaining 38% funds the remainder of the Township's day-to-day operating costs. The Township has four funds that are used annually. The General Fund, Liquid Fuels Fund, Capital Reserve Fund, and Stormwater Management Fund.

Both the Stormwater Management Fund and the Liquid Fuels Fund are restricted in how those funds can be expended. As titled, the Stormwater Management Fund fees collected can only be used for upgrades to the Township's stormwater system. The Liquid Fuels Fund is funded through the state gas tax; therefore, those revenues can be used to pave roadways, purchase rock salt, repair traffic signals, and streetlights, and purchase large equipment items.

The Capital Projects fund is used for expenditures such as major equipment purchases, roadway and pedestrian improvements, major facility and parks repairs and maintenance, vehicle purchases and leasing, green initiatives, and community forestry program. The Capital Fund is funded through the


General Fund revenues. For instance, in 2023, 13% of the General Fund expenses were budgeted as a transfer to the Capital Projects fund to cover these expenses. The General Fund includes all township day-to-day operations not required by law, policy, or external restriction to be recorded in other funds.

Over the next few months, staff will be tasked with preparing a budget for presentation to the Board of Supervisors for consideration for fiscal year 2024. This is neither a speedy nor effortless process. There are countless hours put into this process by both staff and supervisors. The goal is to continue offering the resident the level of services you deserve while being fiscally responsible. I would invite you to take note of the 2024 budget meetings and attend if you would like to see the process in action. Meeting times and dates will be posted on the Township website in September. For more information, you may also visit Moontwp.us and review previous budgets and audits posted on the website.

Curbside Leaf Pick-Up

The Public Works Department will offer curbside leaf pick up beginning November 6-10 and November 13-17, 2023. The schedule will follow the resident's regular garbage collection date. Simply place the leaves at the curb by 7 AM on pick-up day in a biodegradable bag. No plastic bags or cardboard boxes will be accepted. There will be no pickup on Veteran's Day.

Curbside Brush Pick-Up

The Public Works Department will offer curbside brush pickup beginning November 6-10 and November 13-17, 2023, Monday through Friday. The schedule will follow the resident's regular garbage collection. Simply place the brush at the curb by 7 AM on pick-up day. The brush should not exceed six feet in length and four inches in diameter and it should not be bundled or tied. All pick days are weather-dependent. Items placed properly at the curb will be picked up.

💐 Pollinator Pathway

Compost Drop-off/ Pick-up

Residents may drop off yard waste to be composted including tree limbs, leaves, and plant matter. Please use biodegradable bags. Tree limbs should not exceed six feet in length and four inches in diameter and should not be bundled or tied. Residents are reminded that drop-off is for yard waste only. Trash or other materials are not permitted. The composting program provides free mulch and compost to residents. Bring your containers and take as much as you need. The drop-off location is at the Public Works facility at Moon Park. Please notify Public Works before your arrival by calling 412.264.3035.

A stranger coming to Moon Township would have many options for getting here safely and finding a home, but what about a beautiful Monarch butterfly or migrating bird? Could either one travel here safely? If they wanted to stay here and raise a family, would there be room for them? Does it matter if they can live here or not? Our parks and conserved lands, no matter how grand in scale, are too small and separated from one another to adequately preserve the native trees, animals, insects, and animals that our ecosystems depend upon to survive and thrive. Humans depend on these ecosystems for their survival.

We are at a critical point where we are losing so many native plant and animal species that the ecosystem services we rely upon (oxygen, clean water, flood control, pollination, pest control, etc.) are becoming seriously compromised. However, if many people make small changes, we can restore healthy ecological networks and weather the challenges ahead.

The Moon Township Environmental Advisory Council, in collaboration with the Moon Garden Club, The Hollow Oak Land Trust, Moon Parks, the Girl Scouts, the Montour Run Watershed Association, and others, is working to create a Pollinator Pathway for wildlife. Pollinators drive energy up the food chain. They provide almost all food for baby birds and help plants reproduce. 35% of our food is produced because of the work they do. We need individual property owners to help link our fragmented natural areas into a mosaic that pollinators and other wildlife can use. No matter if it's a container planting or a large forested area or meadow, each piece of the pathway is very important to the animals who share our home.

There are 4 key components to the Pollinator Pathway:

1. Plant native plants, especially Keystone plants. These can be trees, shrubs, perennials, or annuals. Try to provide nectar sources for Spring, Summer, and Fall. If you are going to do just one thing, planting an oak tree will have the largest impact. It supports over 500 species of caterpillars!

2. Avoid the use of pesticides and herbicides which will kill pollinators and damage the soil. Seek organic alternatives that do the least harm.

3. Remove invasive plants over time. Invasive plants like garlic mustard and knotweed are like tumors that crowd out native plants that our pollinators need. Start removing the ornamentals you now have that are known to be invasive species. Learn more about invasive species at invasivespecies.gov

4. Rethink your lawn. Lawns are ecological deserts. Think, muse, and strategize about how you might reduce the area that is now lawn. Maybe start by planting a very small area (perhaps a mini meadow), leaving enough green grass for your paths and recreational use. It doesn't matter how small or how large your plantings are; what's most important is that you get started. Plant that oak tree. Build a bed around it and leave the leaf litter.

BOOM! Powerhouse tree and less lawn!

Halloween Safety Tips

Halloween is a festive and fun time of the year for kids, but it can be a little tricky for parents. Here are some safety tips to be sure it's a treat for everyone.

- Make sure your child's costume fits properly and that they can see clearly.
- Apply makeup instead of wearing a mask. Masks can be hot and uncomfortable, and they can obstruct a child's vision.
- Be sure the costume is visible at night. If a costume is dark in color, add some reflective tape on the front and back.
- Purchase a flame-retardant costume.
- Arrange for an adult or responsible teenager to accompany younger children when Trick or Treating.
- Make sure kids never approach an unlit house or enter a house of people you don't know very well.
- Carry a flashlight.
- Be aware of traffic.
- Use sidewalks when possible. If there are no sidewalks, walk on the left side of the street facing oncoming traffic.
- Do not accept rides from anyone but a family member.
- Instruct all trick-or-treaters not to sample treats until they are home and the treats have been examined by an adult.
- Inspect treats at home in a well-lit area and throw away anything opened, partially unwrapped, or not in its original wrapper.
- Call the police if you find any suspicious treats.

In the event of an emergency or to report a threat or crime in progress, always call Moon Township Police Department's Dispatch Center at **412.262.5000** or **911** for immediate assistance. Please do not rely on email or Facebook for emergencies as these are not monitored on a 24/7 basis.

Residents may also call the Dispatch Center to speak with a Moon Police official regarding information related to a crime or victim of a crime. Callers may choose to remain anonymous.

Fire Prevention Week October 8-14

Help us recognize Nation Fire Prevention Week this October and ensure you take the following precautionary steps to help prevent a fire at your home.

Today's homes burn faster than ever. You may have as little as two minutes (or even less time) to safely escape a home fire from the time the smoke alarm sounds. Your ability to get out of a home during a fire depends on the early warning from smoke alarms and planning.

Here are a few simple things you can do to help be prepared in the case of an emergency.

- Make a home escape plan and discuss it with everyone in your home.
- Know at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows leading outside open easily.
- Have an outside meeting place that is a safe distance from the home.
- Practice your home fire drill at least twice a year.
- Close doors behind you as you leave.
- If the smoke alarm sounds, get out and stay out. Never go back in.
- If you must escape through smoke, get low and go under the smoke to your way out.
- Call the fire department once you are outside and safe.

Planning in case a fire breaks out in your home can help keep everyone safe.



Anything deposited in the drop box after that time will be treated as deposited on October 2. During the above closures, service can be obtained from Jordan Tax Service. The best way to reach me will be by e-mail at: **john@moontaxcollector.com**. I will be checking and responding to e-mails regularly except during the closures shown above. In e-mails, be sure to include complete property and contact information including a phone number. The office phone shown will also remain active. Messages can be left, but these may be checked less frequently. An appointment will be made if necessary. One of the common requests received in the tax office is for receipts for the prior year's taxes. I will not be able to provide immediate turnaround in the tax office for these requests, since all of the records are kept at the Jordan Tax Service office in McMurray, PA. The best way to request those will be to call Jordan at **724.731.2311** or to e-mail me at john@moontaxcollector.com. When emailing, please allow 48 hours for turnaround. Your receipt will be e-mailed back once available. Township tax bills were mailed on April 1. Township taxes not paid by July 31 must be paid at a penalty. If you have not received your tax bill, please contact me or Jordan Tax Service.

The Moon Area School District tax for the 2023-24 school year has been set at 23.7856 mils. School tax bills were mailed on July 1. School taxes are due at a discount by August 31. After that date, they will be due at face until October 31, 2023. For School taxes, you may choose the installment plan of 4 payments based on the face tax (no discount). The first installment payment is due August 31. Subsequent payments will be due September 30, October 31, and November 30. If you have not received your tax bill, please contact me or Jordan Tax Service and we will get one to you. I only collect school taxes for properties located in Moon Township. Crescent Township has a property tax collector who collects Moon Area School District taxes for parcels located in Crescent Township. Please notify Jordan Tax Service or the property tax office of any changes to the mailing address or homeowner name. Also, be sure to notify Allegheny County of these changes. Pay particular attention to this if you pay off your mortgage and become responsible for paying the taxes rather than the mortgage company. Check to see if you are eligible for and are receiving the homestead exemption. To be eligible for the homestead exemption, the owner must live in the property as a primary residence. To obtain the homestead exemption, the owner must apply to Allegheny County through Treasurer John Weinstein's office: https://www.alleghenycounty.us/real-estate/abatements-exemptions/act-50/act-50-application-process.aspx. Once approved, you do not need to reapply each year. If there is a change to the deed for any reason, you must reapply. Other property tax abatement opportunities exist and can be found at the County's website: www.alleghenycounty.us/real-estate/ All abatement applications must be submitted to and approved by the County. The Allegheny County assessor's office determines the assessed value of all parcels in Allegheny County. Property taxes are determined based on the assessed value of the property. Changes in assessment do occur occasionally and when they do, it affects the tax across all 3 taxing bodies: County, Township, and School District. If you receive a notice from the County that your assessment has increased, anticipate receiving bills for the increased tax for the Township and School District. If you have a mortgage escrow, it would be advisable to notify them as to what has happened, so they do not ignore the additional bills. Never hesitate to e-mail or call with any real estate property tax questions, comments, or concerns.


