A Letter from the Township Manager

As we are heading into the summer months, which seem to be approaching at a fast and furious pace, I wanted to take a moment and talk about Moon Parks & Recreation, (MP&R) and the Moon Park Foundation.

First Moon Parks & Recreation. Each year during the budget process, the Parks & Recreation Director submits a budget request for the next year to include staffing, expenses for both general programming and senior programming, 4th of July events including the 5K, Robin Hill noon time summer concert series, Moon Market & music, Earth Day, and Spooktacular just to name a few. These events take take both staff time to plan and organize funding to make sure they are successful. In order to make sure events and programming continue at the level you the residents have come to expect, tax dollars are supplemented with sponsorship dollars.

Some years ago, the township created a position of Community Outreach Coordinator. One of the main functions of this position is to develop sponsorship opportunities to assist with township parks programing and events. In 2022, the township's Community Outreach Coordinator, Lauren Madison, worked diligently to acquire monetary sponsorships and in-kind donations (i.e., bags, drinks, art supplies, adverting space through Lamar, banners) valued at approximately \$110K from businesses and individuals to support each of the events and programming. Because of these gratuitous donations, MP&R programming can beoffered at either no cost or minimal cost to the participants/attendees.

Another important arm of MP&R is the Moon Parks Foundation which was formed in 2021. You can find the Mission Statement for the foundation at Moon Township Parks Foundation (moonparksfoundation.org). The purpose of forming this 501c(3) foundation was to gain access to funding opportunities that have been unavailable to the township in the past years. Since the inception in 2021, the foundation has put on two very successful fundraising events.

In 2022 the very first event was held at Black Dog Winery with the proceeds to be used for amenities at the Black Dog Wine Company Dog Park at Moon Park. The event was a sell out and a huge hit. Total proceeds for the evening were \$12K.

In 2023 the Foundation focused fund-raising efforts on upgrades to the Robin Hill Center. This past Saturday, I along with 199 other individuals attended The Spy who Killed Me..., a murder mystery dinner theater. Due to the amazing number of sponsors, their generosity and the work of Lauren and Josh Werner, MP&R, Director, we anticipate the event to bring in over approximately \$15K.

I think it also important to mention with both of the fund-raising events through the Moon Parks Foundation, 10% of the proceeds each year are slated to be given to non-profit organizations. The

chosen recipients were, Canine Service Pals in 2022 and Moon Township Volunteer Fire Company in 2023.

In talking with Lauren, donations, and in-kind support so far in 2023 are approximately \$45K which does not include Foundation event. Hopefully, you can see how important the efforts to gain additional financial support through sponsorships both monetarily and in-kind are a vital part of how MP&R is able to provide programming all through the year and seasons.

If you are a sponsor who has stepped in and supported the township efforts, we would like to thank you. If you are someone who is looking to step in and sponsor an event, please reach out to Lauren Madison, Imadison@moontwp.us.

Or, if you are a resident, we hope you will continue to support the efforts of MP&R by attending the events, enrolling in programming, visiting a park, going on a hike, letting your kids run free, take your dog for a walk or just, sit and enjoy the outdoors.

Moon Township Joins Movement to Become a Wildlife-Friendly Community

The community of Moon Township is launching a new partnership with the National Wildlife Federation's Community Wildlife Habitat™ program to become a healthier, greener, and more wildlife-friendly by committing to create wildlife habitat throughout its communities while also educating and engaging residents.

Healthy habitats and healthy communities go hand-in-hand. Too often communities are suffering from pollution, disinvestment, or other challenges that separate people from the natural world. When human communities suffer, wildlife suffers as well.

"By joining the National Wildlife Federation's Community Wildlife Habitat program, Moon Township is sending a clear and powerful message to communities all over America that people working together can create healthy habitats and healthy communities and make a difference in their own community and beyond," said Patrick Fitzgerald, Senior Director of Community Wildlife.

Moon Township is taking steps to meet the requirements to achieve this certification in areas of outreach, education, and more. Residents of Moon Township can help by certifying their own gardens and yards through the Certified Wildlife Habitat program. Schools, businesses, churches, and HOAs are encouraged to participate in this exciting venture as well. Each residence and organization that is certified will help the Township reach its goal. Additionally, the township is encouraging residents to participate in the "Pollinator Pathways" Million Pollinator Garden Challenge." Moon Township's efforts with pollinators and the Community Wildlife Habitat program will work hand in hand to preserve and enhance the green spaces of our community. "We are excited to start this certification process," says Lisa Shaughnessy, Youth Program Coordinator for Moon Parks and Recreation. "We have already begun projects in some of our parks, like converting lawn areas to meadows with native plants, as well as nature programming for ages 3-12 and our annual Earth Day event. All these efforts will be essential to reach Community Wildlife Certification, which we hope to complete in 1-2 years."

Since 1973, the National Wildlife Federation has provided millions of people with the basic guidelines for making their landscapes more hospitable for wildlife. To date, through the Certified Wildlife Habitat™ program, the National Wildlife Federation has certified more than 250,000 sites including yards, schools, businesses, community gardens, parks, and places of worship. Each of these sites provides the four basic elements that all wildlife need to thrive: food, water, cover and places to raise young, while integrating sustainable gardening and landscaping practices.

To become certified as a National Wildlife Federation Community Wildlife Habitat™ Moon Township is calling on its residents to certify their own property at NWF.org/Certify and join our education and outreach efforts to learn about how residents can create a healthier, greener and more wildlife-friendly community. Stormwater Update

The Township holds an NPDES General Permit for Stormwater Discharges from Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4), as issued by the Pennsylvania Department (PADEP). The permit requires the Township to implement a Stormwater Management Program designed to reduce the discharge of pollutants from its MS4 (storm sewer system), aimed at protecting and improving stormwater quality and preserving the nature of our streams and lakes. All of these streams and lakes are located within an overall watershed. Moon Township is part of the overall Ohio River Watershed, but is also made up of smaller watersheds. These watersheds include McCabe Run, Spring Run, McClarens Run, Flaugherty Run, and Montour Run. All of these individual watersheds were classified as impaired by PADEP for siltation. As part of the Township's most recent MS4 Permit Renewal, a Pollutant Reduction Plan (PRP) was required to be adopted. The goal of the PRP is improve the water quality of the streams within the Township. The PRP is currently being implemented within the Township via Best Management Practices (BMPs). These BMPs include upgrades to existing storm sewer infrastructure, stormwater detention facilities, and stream restoration. To date, the Township has retrofitted 8 stormwater facilities and constructed 2 new facilities. For 2023, it is anticipated that an additional 3-6 existing stormwater management facilities will be retrofitted as well as construction of a new underground detention tank. The last phase of the PRP Implementation includes work in Olson Park; a new stormwater management facility will be constructed as well as restoration of the existing stream channels. DEP is currently reviewing the permit application. Once the permit has been issued, work will be completed in Phases over the next several years.

Moon Township Announces Moon Township Alerts to Keep Community Informed

Public Safety Officials Encourage Residents to Sign Up For Local Emergency Notifications To Be Better Prepared for an Emergency

Public safety officials in Moon Township today announced that Moon Township Alerts is now available to all residents, replacing the previous Swift 911 system. Moon Township Alerts is a free service that allows individuals to receive notifications sent from state and local authorities to stay informed on potentially hazardous situations involving weather, traffic, and other emergencies.

The switch to Moon Township Alerts allows residents to receive alerts via phone, text and email, and answer poll questions that will give Moon Township officials critical information during emergency situations. Individuals who are signed up for alerts will receive reliable information about the coronavirus, including tailored updates based on their specific needs and geographic location.

Individuals who were previously signed up for Swift 911 are encouraged to sign up to Moon Township Alerts to add additional and updated information to the new platform to ensure accuracy. Residents and travelers to Moon Township who were not previously signed up for Swift 911 should sign up for free at https://www.smart911.com/smart911/ref/reg.action?pa=moontwp to receive timely and actionable emergency alerts via email, text, or voice message. They can also identify when and how they are alerted and communicated with before, during, and after emergencies.

"Moon Township Alerts strengthens Moon Township officials' ability to communicate with residents when it matters most," said Greg Seamon, Public Safety Director. "This service allows for critical communication with the public and provides individuals with the information needed to stay safe or take precautions during hazardous or emergency situations, especially the current coronavirus outbreak."

Moon Township Alerts is trusted by thousands of institutions including state and local authorities, business and educational institutions. Moon Township Alerts sends millions of messages daily and during critical situations such as severe weather.

From the Moon Township Historical Society...

James W Fecker a builder of telescopes for observatories around the world. He worked with his father at Warner and Swasey company. Making drawings for 36" an 72" observatory telescopes. Also grinding glass for mirrors used around the world. Upon the death of Dr. John Brashear of Pittsburgh, he was asked to take over Brashear's shops.

James and wife Corinne with two daughters lived on Stoops Ferry Road, now owned by the Elk's club.

During the war effort Mr. Fecker devoted his plant to the war works. Many meetings were held at the house, along with farm and garden club meetings.

For one daughter a large gathering was held at the home with a very descriptive wedding.

James's hobby was photography and on his farm the hillside was advantages for this as were the wooded areas.

The property was named STARWAE.

Don't Believe the Label: **Flushable Wipes Clog Sewers**

Many household products are labeled and marketed as disposable and/or flushable including baby and adult personal hygiene products, household wipes, and cleaning towelettes. While they will flush down the toilet, it is not at all safe to do so.

Unlike toilet paper, these products do not break down once they are flushed. They can cause blockages in your on-site sewer line, especially older pipelines that may have greases, roots, or other obstructions already existing. A repair of the on-site sewer line can leave the homeowner or business owner with a very costly sewer repair.

When these products make their way into the public sewer system, they collect causing very large obstructions and clogs in the main collector lines and tangles in pump stations. These situations require repair or replacement of equipment, which affect sewage rates.

John Riley, General Manager of the Moon Township Municipal Authority, reported that MTMA charges the lowest water rates in the region, as well as competitive sewage rates. This is the result of proper facility maintenance and the ability of MTMA to manage and conduct many of their projects

"I urge everyone to help keep our rates low by knowing what's not appropriate to flush," said Riley. "Keeping these items out of the sewer system avoids costly repairs that would eventually have to be passed on to our customers."



Jordan Tax Service will continue as the Deputy Tax Collector. By law, every Tax collector must appoint a Deputy to serve in case the Tax Collector unable to serve for some reason. Jordan will continue to do the day-to-day work, all payments will be processed, and all records will be maintained at their offices in McMurray, PA. As such, Jordan Tax Service should be the property owner's first contact for questions regarding bills, payments, receipts, tax certifications, etc. Jordan's Customer Service Center is open Monday through Friday, (8:00 AM to 4:30 PM). Their phone number is **724-731-2311.**

The Tax Office in the Moon Community Service Center will be open for walk-in customer service Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM with the following exceptions: The Tax Office will be closed during the following periods: June 12-16, 2023, July 13-20, 2023, August 21-25, 2023, September 18-22, 2023, and October 3-16, 2023. The Tax Office will be open Monday, October 2, 2023 from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM to accommodate the 2nd installment payment for School taxes due September 30, 2023. The drop box outside the Tax Office will be emptied Monday morning at 9:00 AM. All payments in the box at that time will be considered timely for the September 30 Payment. Anything left in the box after that time will be treated as deposited on October 2.

During the above closures, service can be obtained from Jordan Tax Service. The best way to reach me will be by e-mail at: **john@moontaxcollector. com**. I will be checking and responding to e-mails regularly except during the closures shown above. In e-mails, be sure to include complete property and contact information including a phone number. The office phone shown will also remain active. Messages can be left, but these may be checked less frequently. An appointment will be made if necessary.

One of the common requests received in the tax office is for receipts for the prior year's taxes. I will not be able to provide immediate turnaround in the tax office for these requests, since all of the records are kept at the Jordan Tax Service office in McMurray, PA. The best way to request those will be to call Jordan at **724-731-2311** or to e-mail me at **john@moontaxcollector.com**. When e-mailing, please allow 48 hours for turnaround. Your receipt will be e-mailed back once available.

Township tax bills were mailed April 1. The good news is that the Township tax rate for 2023 remains the same at 2.74 mils. Township taxes can be paid at discount until May 31, 2023. After that date,

they are due at face until July 31, 2023. If you have not received your tax bill, please contact me or Jordan Tax Service and we will get one to you.

The Moon Area School District tax rate will be determined when the budget for the 2023-24 school year is approved in June. School tax bills will be mailed July 1. School taxes will be due at discount by August 31. After that date, they will be due at face until October 31, 2023. I only collect School taxes for properties located in Moon Township. Crescent Township has their own property tax collector who collects Moon Area School District taxes for parcels located in Crescent Township.

Please notify Jordan Tax Service or the property tax office for any changes to the mailing address or homeowner name. Also, be sure to notify Allegheny County of these changes. Pay particular attention to this if you pay off your mortgage and become responsible for paying the taxes rather than the mortgage company.

Check to see if you are eligible for and are receiving the homestead exemption. To be eligible for the homestead exemption, the owner must live in the property as a primary residence. To obtain the homestead exemption, the owner must apply to Allegheny County through Treasurer John Weinstein's office: https://www.alleghenycounty.us/real-estate/abatements-exemptions/act-50/act-50-application-process.aspx. Once approved, you do not need to reapply each year. If there is a change to the deed for any reason, you must reapply. Other property tax abatement opportunities exist and can be found at the County's website: https://www.alleghenycounty.us/real-estate/abatements-exemptions/index.aspx. All abatement applications must be submitted to and approved by the County.

The Allegheny County assessor's office determines the assessed value of all parcels in Allegheny County. Property taxes are determined based on the assessed value of the property. Changes in assessment do occur occasionally and when they do, it affects the tax across all 3 taxing bodies: County, Township and School District. If you receive a notice from the County that your assessment has increased, anticipate receiving bills for the increased tax for the Township and School District. If you have a mortgage escrow, it would be advisable to notify them as to what has happened, so they do not ignore the additional bills.
