A Letter from the Township Manager

This past year my articles have targeted litter and the importance of talking with the Community Development Department before starting any projects around your home and property. The feedback we received from the residents on both of those subjects is appreciated and will be used to build on in the future.

In this Messenger, I would like to talk about the road systems running through Moon Township. The Township is 68.26 square miles, with more than 146.5 miles of roadways. To break down further, the Township owns 74.63 miles, the county owns 3.65 miles, and the state owns 45.81.

When it comes to maintaining these roadways, each government entity is responsible for paving, curbing, stormwater management, signage, litter control, and roadway markings on their portion.

This summer PennDOT used the "oil and chip" method to overlay the state roadways running through Moon. This method, even though it is not favored by motorists, is a technique that PennDOT stands by. It is their belief, and their research tells them, that oil and chip usage is a low-cost way to extend the usefulness of roadways when PennDOT does not have the funding available to repave a roadway. "This maintenance treatment seals the road surface to keep water out while restoring the friction of the surface to enhance traction." (PA.Gov).

During the budget meetings, the Board of Supervisors considers roadway improvements early in the process. In the 2022 budget, there is an allotment of \$1 mil for roadway improvements. In April 2022, the Board of Supervisors awarded those projects which totaled \$1,036,359. The roadways included are Scottsdale Drive, McCormick Road, Whispering Wood Drive, Linden Court, Beagle Drive, Shafer Road, Loch Shin Drive, Fitzrandolph Drive, Montclair Drive, Loch Shin Playlot, and Bon Meade Access Drive. The latter two of those listed, account for the overage and are budgeted in the Stormwater Fund and Short-Term Borrowing Fund.

Roadway improvements are currently the costliest items to the budget given today's economy. As you can see from the above list, the \$1 mil budgeted out of the Capital Fund does not go far enough. And please note, this does not take into consideration routine maintenance, such as a pothole or catch basin repairs, curb work or crack sealing that must also be done each year.

I have received phone calls and emails concerning PennDOT's "oil and chip" program. This type of project is not one the township has undertaken on Township roads and is hopefully one that we can avoid for years to come.

Curbside Leaf Pick-Up

The Public Works Department will offer curbside leaf pick up beginning Nov. 7-11 and Nov. 14-18, 2022. The schedule will follow the resident's regular garbage collection date. Simply place the leaves at the curb by 7 AM on pick-up day in a biodegradable bag. No plastic bags or cardboard boxes will be accepted. There will be no pickup on Veteran's Day.



Curbside Brush Pick-Up

The Public Works Department will offer curbside brush pick-up beginning November 2, Monday through Friday. The schedule will follow the resident's regular garbage collection. Simply place the brush at the curb by 7 AM on pick-up day. The brush should not exceed six feet in length and four inches in diameter and it should not be bundled or tied.

All pick days are weather-dependent. Items placed properly at the curb will be picked up.



Compost Drop-off/ Pickup

Residents may drop off yard waste to be composted including tree limbs, leaves, and plant matter. Please use biodegradable bags. Tree limbs should not exceed six feet in length and four inches in diameter and should not be bundled or tied. Residents are reminded that drop-off is for yard waste only. Trash or other materials are not permitted. The composting program provides free mulch and compost to residents. Bring your containers and take as much as you need. The drop-off location is at the Public Works facility at Moon Park. Please notify Public Works before your arrival by calling **412.262.1700.**

Halloween Safety Tips

Halloween is a festive and fun time of the year for kids, but it can be a little tricky for parents. Here are some safety tips to be sure it's a treat for everyone.

- · Make sure your child's costume fits properly and that they can see clearly.
- · Apply makeup instead of wearing a mask. Masks can be hot and uncomfortable, and they can obstruct a child's vision.
- · Be sure the costume is visible at night. If a costume is dark in color, add some reflective tape on the front and back.
- · Purchase a costume that is flame retardant.
- Arrange for an adult or responsible teenager to accompany younger children when Trick or Treating.
- · Make sure kids never approach an unlit house, or enter a house of people you don't know very well.
- · Carry a flashlight.
- · Be aware of traffic.
- · Use sidewalks when possible. If there are no sidewalks, walk on the left side of the street facing oncoming traffic.
- Do not accept rides from anyone but a family member.
- · Instruct all trick-or-treaters not to sample treats until they are home and the treats have been examined by an adult.
- · Inspect treats at home in a well-lit area and throw away anything opened, partially unwrapped, or not in its original wrapper.
- · Call the police if you find any suspicious treats.

In the event of an emergency or to report a threat or crime in progress, always call Moon Township Police Department's Dispatch Center at **412.262.5000** or **911** for immediate assistance. Please do not rely on email or Facebook for emergencies as these are not monitored on a 24/7 basis.

Residents may also call the Dispatch Center to speak with a Moon Police official regarding information related to a crime or victim of a crime. Callers may choose to remain anonymous.

Fire Prevention Week October 9-15

The National Fire Protection Association is celebrating the 100th anniversary of Fire Prevention Week. This year's FPW campaign, "Fire won't wait. Plan your escape", works to educate everyone about simple but important actions they can take to keep themselves and those around them safe from home fires.

Today's homes burn faster than ever. You may have as little as two minutes (or even less time) to safely escape a home fire from the time the smoke alarm sounds. Your ability to get out of a home during a fire depends on the early warning from smoke alarms and planning.

Here are a few simple things you can do to help be prepared in the case of an emergency.

- · Make a home escape plan and discuss it with everyone in your home.
- · Know at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows leading outside open easily.
- · Have an outside meeting place that is a safe distance from the home.
- · Practice your home fire drill at least twice a year.
- · Close doors behind you as you leave.
- · If the smoke alarm sounds, get out and stay out. Never go back in.
- · If you must escape through smoke, get low and go under the smoke to your way out.
- · Call the fire department once you are outside and safe.

Planning in case a fire breaks out in your home can help keep everyone safe.

Moon Park Pavilion Rentals



Property tax "season" is underway. The School District tax bills were mailed on July 1. If you did not receive your School tax bill, please contact Jordon Tax Service at 724.731.2311 to ask for it. Note that the obligation to pay property taxes is not relieved or delayed because one did not receive a tax bill. Discount opportunities are not extended either.

Taxpayers can still pay School property tax in person at the Tax Office. Hours have been established for such collection during the discount period. Jordan Tax Service will be onsite during these times to assist with collection. They are:

August 16 1:00 - 4:00 PM August 29 1:00 - 4:00 PM August 24 9:00 AM- Noon August 31 9:00 AM - Noon

There is an installment option available for School taxes. No discount is permitted when using the installment option. If you wish to pay School taxes in installments, the first payment must be in the exact amount of the installment payment listed on the tax bill and must be paid by August 31, 2022. The remaining installment coupons will be mailed following receipt of the first payment. The due dates for the remaining 3 payments are September 30, 2022, October 31, 2022, and November 30, 2022. Installments paid after these dates are subject to a 10% penalty. A taxpayer who is delinquent by more than 10 days, on more than 2 installment payments will not be eligible for the installment option in the following school year.

The Tax Office in the Moon Community Service Center will be open for walk-in customer service Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 9:00 to 11:00 AM. The Tax Office will be closed September 12-16, 2022

Jordan Tax Service should be the property owner's first contact for questions regarding bills, payments, receipts, tax certifications, etc. Payments are processed in Jordan's office in McMurray, PA. Jordan's Customer Service Center is open Monday through Friday, (8:00 AM to 4:30 PM). Their phone number is **724.731.2311.**

I am available to provide service as necessary in the event questions are not routine. The best way to reach me will be at the e-mail I have established: john@moontaxcollector.com. I will be checking and responding to e-mails regularly. In e-mails, be sure to include complete property and contact information including a phone number. The office phone shown will also remain active. Messages can be left, but these may be checked less frequently. An appointment will be made if necessary.

The Moon Township real estate millage rate remains at 2.74 mills with a \$15,000 homestead exemption for those eligible. The homestead exemption is deducted from the property's full assessment before the calculation of the tax owed. The Moon Area School District tax rate for the 2022-23 School year is 22.6746 mills with a \$7149 homestead exemption. The School District homestead exemption is dependent on gambling revenues, so it varies from year to year. To be eligible for the homestead exemption, the owner must live on the property as a primary residency. To obtain the homestead exemption, the owner must apply to Allegheny County through Treasurer John Weinstein's office: www.alleghenycounty. us/real-estate/abatements-exemptions. Once approved, you do not need to reapply each year. If there is a change to the deed for any reason, you must reapply. Other property tax abatement opportunities exist and can be found at the County's website: www.alleghenycounty.us/real-estate/ abatements-exemptions. All abatement applications must be submitted to and approved by the County.

The County of Allegheny County assessor's office determines the assessed value of all parcels in Allegheny County. Property taxes are determined based on the assessment value of the property. Changes in assessment do occur occasionally and when they do, it affects the tax across all 3 taxing bodies: County, Township, and School District. If you receive a notice from the County that your assessment has increased, anticipate receiving bills for the increased tax for the Township and School District. If you have a mortgage escrow, it would be advisable to notify them as to what has happened, so they do not ignore the additional bills.

Please notify the property tax office of any changes to the mailing address or homeowner's name. Also, be sure to notify Allegheny County of these changes. Pay particular attention to this if you pay off your mortgage and become responsible for paying the taxes rather than the mortgage company.

Never hesitate to e-mail or call with any real estate property tax questions, comments, or concerns.
