# LOCAL GOVERNMENT make it moon

## A Letter from the Township Manager

As Moon Township continues to grow, the need to re-evaluate the township services will come to the forefront in 2023. Before I go any further, I would like to say the goal of this exercise will be to determine which services, if any, we may need to enhance, tweak, cut back on, or what new service(s) we need to consider offering our residents.

This evaluation of township operations will require direct participation from each department director and their staff. Each department will be asked to dig deep into staffing, programming, and day to day operations. Talking about what works and what does not and trying to answer the biggest question, "what can we do better?" Once each department runs through this exercise, the department director will meet and share the findings.

You may ask why I am explaining this. Isn't this what you should be doing? Well, yes it is. But what I have found is the residents of Moon Township like to share their thoughts and ideas and be involved in what is happening. For example, Moon Township has 16 boards and commissions, with a total of 73 volunteers who serve on those boards. In 2018, Waste Management stopped collecting glass as part of its recycling collection. A large number of residents were not happy with this decision. So, in cooperation with MTMA, the township now hosts 2 glass recycling bins at the public works garage on Mill Road. Without public input, MTMA and the EAC board may not have moved forward to obtain these dumpsters for glass recycling.

I also believe it is easy for us to discount what we don't utilize. For example, MTVFC. If you have never had to utilize their service for a fire call, you may not realize their importance. No different than with the police. You know they are around. But, if you never have an interaction with them, you may not realize their importance. I would like to say the same holds true for all departments such as, parks & recreation, planning & zoning, MCA-TV, and public works.

As our staff works through this exercise, I anticipate a survey or questions being posted on the township media sources for your input. However, I would also invite you to not wait for the survey or questions and contact me directly if you have some thoughts of your own you would like to share or questions you would like to ask.

The goal is to evaluate, discuss and present out findings and facts in 2023 to the Board of Supervisors and begin implementing them in 2024.

# 2023 Budget

Each year, the Moon Township Board of Supervisors is charged with the responsibility of enacting a balanced budget. The budget summarizes the revenues and expenditures the Township Administration expects to encounter during the course of a fiscal year. While the administration and the Finance Department strive to ensure that the Township does not go over budget, there can be unforeseen circumstances that arise during the course of the year. Beginning in October, staff members begin meeting with the Board of Supervisors to outline and prepare the next year's budget. The budget is broken up by revenue, expenditures, and fund reserve, which make up the total available monies for the year.

The Township's main revenues come from real estate taxes, local enabling taxes, licenses and permits, fines, interests, and rent, state-shared revenue, and departmental fees.

Budget expenditures are broken up by department and include all expenses, including insurance, workers' compensation, and purchases.

## **Curbside Yard Waste**

## Pickup Monday, April 3 - Thursday, April 13

Pickups follow residents' regular garbage collection. Simply place yard waste at the curb by 8 AM on pickup day. Residents are reminded to use biodegradable paper bags. Yard waste in plastic bags or boxes will not be picked up. Tree limbs should not exceed six feet in length and four inches in diameter and should not be bundled or tied. Please neatly place your yard waste at the curb.



## Curbside Tree Branch Pickup Monday, April 3 - Thursday, April 13

Pickups generally follow residents' regular garbage collection. Please place branches at the curb no later than 8 a.m. on pickup day. Tree branches should not exceed six feet in length and four inches in diameter and should not be bundled or tied. This is a separate pick-up from the yard waste collection, so do not be alarmed with crews do not come at the same time. Tree limbs should not exceed six feet in length and should not be bundled or tied. Please neatly place your yard waste at the curb.



## **Compost Drop-off/ Pickup**

Residents may drop off yard waste to be composted including tree limbs, leaves, and plant matter. Please use biodegradable bags. Tree limbs should not exceed six feet in length and four inches in diameter and should not be bundled or tied. Residents are reminded that drop-off is for yard waste only. Trash or other materials are not permitted. The composting program provides free mulch and compost to residents. Bring your containers or truck and take as much mulch as you need. The drop-off location is at the Public Works facility at Moon Park.



## Tips for Running and Walking at Night

For some Moon Township residents, the best time to get a workout in may be in the early hours before the sun rises or after hours when the sun has set. Running in the daylight is typically the best option as most fatalities happen in the dark. But if this is the best option for you, please be sure to follow these safety tips and tricks:

1.) Run Against Traffic: It's easier to avoid cars when you seem them coming! Be sure to stick to roads with shoulders and sidewalks.

2.) Choose a Well-Lit Route: The routes with the most light are the best choice.

3.) Be Visible: Make sure you aren't wearing dark colors. Some of the best opitions are white, yellow, or orange. It is best to also be wearing reflective gear and a headlamp so you can see and be seen.

4.) Have an ID with you: In case of emergency, make sure you carry your license and perhaps a Road iD with emergency contact information.

5.) Do Not Stick to a Routine: It is harder to be tracked by attacers of you change up your route and time.

6.) Stay in Pairs: Try and not to run alone. With social media, it is now easier more than ever to find a group of people to run with.

7.) Keep in Touch: Make sure to run with a cell phone so you can contact emergency services as quickly as possible.

8.) Keep an eye out: Even if there are no cars around, make sure to keep your eye open for other runners or walkers in the area.

9.) Ears open: Don't use headphones if running at night. Keep all of your senses open for cars, people, and animals. If music is necessary, keep it low or stick to one headphone.

10.) Follow your Instinct: If you feel unsafe, run to the next safest location. Call emergency services for anything suspicious.

# FIRE SAFETY make it moon

## Allegheny County Health Dept Open Burning Regulations

- Open burning may only be conducted in accordance with ACHD Article XXI §2105.50 "Open Burning." Municipal ordinances may only be equal to or more stringent than ACHD regulations.
- No person shall conduct, or allow to be conducted, the open burning of any material, except where the Department has issued an open burning permit, or where the open burning is conducted in accordance to Article XXI §2105.50 and is done in a manner which contributes a negligible amount of air contaminants.
- No material other than clean wood, propane or natural gas may be open burned EXCEPT for:
  - Commercially available fire logs, paraffin logs or wood pellets
  - Paper or commercial smokeless fire starters in order to start a fire
  - Charcoal for the preparation of food only
- Fires may be no larger than 3' wide by 3' long by 2' high.
  - Fires must be at least 15 feet from the nearest
  - neighbor's dwelling or inhabited area, including:
    - Property Line
      Roadway
      Sidewalk
      Public Ace
      - Public Access Area
- Wood burning activities are prohibited on Air Quality Action days, with the exception of burning for the commercial preparation of food, or in the municipalities identified in Subsection 2106.06.d when a Mon Valley Air Pollution Watch or Warning has been issued under Section 2106.06.
  - Subscribe to receive email, text or smart phone app notifications of burn ban days at: alleghenycounty.us/alerts
- Burning may be prohibited/reduced if considered a nuisance, based on the following criteria:
  - The severity of the amount of
  - air pollutants
  - The duration or frequency of open burning
  - The topography of the surroundings
  - The meteorological conditions
- Open burning permits are available for ceremonies fostering of agriculture, abatement of a public health hazard and firefighting instruction; however, all permitted open burning is prohibited on Air Quality Action Days, or in the municipalities identified in Subsection 2106.06.d when a Mon Valley Air Pollution Watch or Warning has been issued under Section 2106.06.

# In Memory of George Downes

The Moon Township Historical Society, thanks to the generosity of the Moon Township Board of Supervisors, will soon be opening the door on a new Historical Society Room inside the Moon Municipal Building. The goal of the Historical Society is to preserve Moon Township's history and make it accessible to all. The new room is located just to the left of the main meeting room. We will be announcing a grand opening date later this year.

The Historical Society is open to everyone. If you'd like to learn more about us, we would encourage you to attend one of our public meetings that are held at 6:30 PM in the Township's main meeting room. The Moon Township Historical Society will be running a spot in future Messengers featuring pieces of Moon Township history. For the spring Messenger, we thought it would be appropriate to address the history of the Downes Fire Station as it is about to re-open.

George Downes had many years of service in the Moon Township Fire Department and community. George owned a grocery store and home in Carnot and answered fire calls and sounded the siren for many years. His house was located at 934 Narrows Run road, which is now known as University Boulevard, across from the fire hall and was built in 1942. At that time, wiring was installed under the street so he could operate this siren. Geroge is buried at Sharon cemetery.

The Downes Fire House is dedicated to George Downes, the orginal Downes Fire Station was handbuilt by the Moon Township Volunteer Fire Department. The renovated Downes Station will be open this spring.

Valley Ambulance Authority ("VAA") is proud to serve as the designated community provider of emergency medical services and medical transportation for Moon Township.

VAA also provides EMS services to Moon Township and the neighboring communities of Crescent Township, Coraopolis Borough, and Neville Island.

Moon Township residents in need of an emergency ambulance should call 9-1-1.

VAA's mobile intensive care units are staffed 24 hours a day / 7 days week by more than fifty (50) dedicated, professional Paramedics and EMTs. The ambulances typically respond from the Authority headquarters building located at 3550 University Blvd. in Moon Township.

VAA has earned a reputation for providing prompt, professional emergency medical services. Last year, **Valley Ambulance Authority responded to more than 3,300 emergency ambulance calls in Moon Township.** Total ambulance responses in our combined service area totaled more than 7,500 in 2022. We also provided more than 3,000 non-emergency wheelchair van transports to patients within the service area.

Valley Ambulance Authority, a non-profit municipal authority, relies on community support and billing fees to fund its operating budget which totals more than \$3 million dollars annually. Residents are often surprised to learn that VAA receives no municipal tax revenue!

Moon Township residents can support VAA through participation in its annual subscription program. The subscription program provides residents with unlimited emergency medical services and an opportunity to often save hundreds of dollars by providing a 50% discount on any outstanding balance related to emergency medical services.

The subscription program also provides access to certain types of non-emergency ambulance services and discounted rates for wheelchair van transports.

VAA annual subscription fees again this year are only \$65.00 for a family or \$45.00 for an individual. VAA subscriptions are valid from March 1, 2023 through February 28, 2024.

To keep up with increasing expenses, Valley Ambulance Authority also conducts an annual capital fund raising campaign. Residents may contribute tax deductible donations by visiting VAA's web site at **www.valleyamb.org**

## The list of recyclable material is as follows:

- (1) Aluminum cans.
- (2) Tin cans.

Do not recycle metal non-can items such as foil, lawnmower blades, dog chains.

- (3) Plastics Clean bottles, jugs, jars only . <u>No</u> plastic bags. Do not put recycling materials in plastic bags.
  - **#1 PET** (Polyethylene Terephthalate) Clear containers typically used for soft drinks and bottled water. No food trays.
    - **#2 HDPE** (High Density Polyethylene): Colored or translucent plastic. Typically used for milk or juice containers and common household chemicals, <u>no</u> plastic bags.

## Plastics NOT RECYCLED

Types #3 through #7, bags, film wrap, black PET trays or food trays of any type, plastic items such as, but not limited to flower pots, vinyl siding, records, VCR tapes.

Newspaper and Mixed Paper – Any clean paper that can be torn, copier paper, soft back books, colored paper, file folders, insides of hardback books, bar line paper, magazines, mail inserts, business cards, catalogues, telephone books, poster board, envelopes, greeting cards, chip board (cereal and other similar boxes must be flattened to reduce volume).

<u>Do not recycle</u> pizza boxes and other paper with food or grease contamination. These are disposed of with regular trash. Do <u>not</u> recycle shredded or small pieces of paper or plastic covered paper such as milk cartons or paper drink cups.

(5) Corrugated Cardboard – May be flattened to reduce volume. All recycling materials, including cardboard must be placed inside the recycling toter for collection.

## Other NOT RECYCLED

**Glass** <u>may not</u> be placed in the recycling toter. Glass may be recycled at the Moon Township Public Works garage at 1115 Stevenson Mill Road. Glass may also be disposed with regular trash. NO styrofoam. NO rubber products. These are disposed of with regular trash.

The 2022 property tax year is now history. Any unpaid taxes for the Township of Moon and the Moon Area School District have been referred to the delinquent tax collector, Weiss, Burkardt & Kramer. I am no longer allowed to collect property taxes for 2022 or any prior year. All questions or payments for prior years must be directed to Weiss, Burkardt & Kramer. Their telephone number is **412-391-0160**. It is best to contact them to obtain the correct amount to pay before sending a payment.

Jordan Tax Service will continue as the Deputy Tax Collector. By law, every Tax collector must appoint a Deputy to serve in case the Tax Collector unable to serve for some reason. Jordan will continue to do the day-to-day work, all payments will be processed, and all records will be maintained at their offices in McMurray, PA. As such, Jordan Tax Service should be the property owner's first contact for questions regarding bills, payments, receipts, tax certifications, etc. Jordan's Customer Service Center is open Monday through Friday, (8:00 AM to 4:30 PM). Their phone number is **724-731-2311.** 

The Tax Office in the Moon Community Service Center will be open for walk-in customer service Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM except for an extended closure from February 16 thru March 13, 2023. During this time, service must be obtained from Jordan Tax Service.

I am will continue to provide service as necessary. The best way to reach me will be by e-mail at: john@moontaxcollector.com. I will be checking and responding to e-mails regularly except during the extended closure shown above. In e-mails, be sure to include complete property and contact information including a phone number. The office phone shown will also remain active. Messages can be left, but these may be checked less frequently. An appointment will be made if necessary.

One of the common requests received in the tax office is for receipts for the prior year's taxes. I will not be able to provide immediate turnaround in the tax office for these requests, since all of the records are kept at the Jordan Tax Service office in McMurray, PA. The best way to request those will be to call Jordan at **724-731-2311** or to e-mail me at **john@moontaxcollector.com**. When e-mailing, please allow 48 hours for turnaround. Your receipt will be e-mailed back once available.

Check to see if you are eligible for and are receiving the homestead exemption. To be eligible for the homestead exemption, the owner must live in the property as a primary residence. To obtain the homestead exemption, the owner must apply to Allegheny County through Treasurer John Weinstein's office: https://www.alleghenycounty.us/real-estate/abatements-exemptions/act-50/act-50-application-process.aspx. Once approved, you do not need to reapply each year. If there is a change to the deed for any reason, you must reapply. Other property tax abatement opportunities exist and can be found at the County's website: https://www.alleghenycounty.us/real-estate/abatements-exemptions/index.aspx. All abatement applications must be submitted to and approved by the County.

The Allegheny County assessor's office determines the assessed value of all parcels in Allegheny County. Property taxes are determined based on the assessed value of the property. Changes in assessment do occur occasionally and when they do, it affects the tax across all 3 taxing bodies: County, Township and School District. If you receive a notice from the County that your assessment has increased, anticipate receiving bills for the increased tax for the Township and School District. If you have a mortgage escrow, it would be advisable to notify them as to what has happened, so they do not ignore the additional bills.

Please notify Jordan Tax Service or the property tax office for any changes to the mailing address or homeowner name. Also, be sure to notify Allegheny County of these changes. Pay particular attention to this if you pay off your mortgage and become responsible for paying the taxes rather than the mortgage company.

The good news is that the Township tax rate for 2023 remains the same at 2.74 mils. The bills for the Moon Township Real Estate taxes will be mailed the first week of April. If you do not receive yours by April 15, call Jordan Tax service or notify me at john@moontaxcollector.com and we will get you a copy of the bill. Pennsylvania law says that you are responsible for the tax regardless of whether you receive a bill or not. Neither Jordan nor I have the authority to waive penalties or restore discounts.

The Moon Area School District tax rate will be determined when the budget for the 2023-24 school year is approved in June. School tax bills will be mailed July 1. I only collect School taxes for properties located in Moon Township. Crescent Township has their own property tax collector who collect Moon Area School District taxes for parcels located in Crescent Township.




