FRESH IS BACK MOON FARMERS' MARKET

Farmers' Market season is upon us. After last year's successful revitalization of the Moon Farmers' Market, we anticipate this season to be even bigger and better! Between June 3rd and September 30th, join us every Wednesday, 3:30-6:30pm at the Township Administration Building (1000 Beaver Grade Road) for fresh, local produce, meats, baked goods, crafts, hot and prepared foods, wine, dog treats and more. CSA

Didn't get your fill at the Farmers' Market? Community Supported Agriculture is a program where a community of individuals pledge to support a farm operation by becoming shareholders, covering anticipated costs and in return receiving a share of the bounty throughout the growing season. Hemlock Woolly Adelgid

The Hemlock Woolly Adelgid has been spotted on our Eastern Hemlock Trees in Robin Hill Park. First reported in 1951 in Virginia, the pest has now spread to at least 16 states, affecting both Eastern Hemlock and the Carolina Hemlock trees. The Hemlock Woolly Adelgid, originally from Asia, are tiny insects similar to aphids, which suck fluid from the base of hemlock needles and inject toxins into the tree as it feeds, accelerating needle drop and branch dieback. Affected hemlocks often have a grayish-green appearance as opposed to the typical shiny, dark green color, and once heavily infested with HWA, unless treated, the Hemlock tree usually dies within 5-15 years. HWA are easily transported by wind, birds and mammals.

If you have hemlock trees on your property, look at the underside of the branches and observe whether or not it is infested with HWA. In late October

through early April, the pest will appear as egg sacs, which look as if the branch is covered in a light dusting of snow and are easiest to detect. The remainder of the year, the HWA look like aphids and are not as obvious.

While there are biological controls in the form of predator beetles from Asia, as well as chemical controls, we recommend homeowners purchase natural horticultural oils- these come based in cottonseed, soybean or neem- and spray them as directed onto the the pests themselves. This safe, inexpensive and natural oil will smother and dry out both the adelgid and the eggs, and can be purchased at garden centers or online.

Controlling Woolly Adelgid

- Do not disturb shallow roots of hemlock trees with heavy equipment or by digging or tilling
- Keep hemlocks well-watered during droughts
- Remove bird feeders from infested trees- birds transport HWA
- Remove large, heavily infested trees
- Do not change the slope of the land or water runoff patterns
- Do not fertilize trees infested with Hemlock Woolly Adelgid with nitrogen.
- Do not apply lime or weed killer near trees
- Do not put infested branches out for municipal tree and limb pickup. This will only spread the HWA. If you have infested branches and need to dispose of them, please call us at **412.262.1700**

Guidelines for *Property Maintenance & Code Requirements*

The Property Maintenance Code

establishes a broad purpose of the code to protect the public health, safety, and welfare in both existing residential and non-residential structures and on all existing premises. This code provides Moon Township with the tools to reduce risk created by deteriorated or unsafe buildings and help upgrade and maintain other existing structures. The code requirements are intended to represent the minimum acceptable level of public health and safety.



Rules to Remember

TALL GRASS AND WEEDS

You must keep grass and weeds from exceeding 10" in height. Weeds and grass must be maintained around structures to prevent fire and health hazards.

FENCES

Fences must be at least a 22 foot setback from the roadway curb-edge of the asphalt.

Maximum of 6 feet tall. The fence may go up to the property line on the side and rear.

Fences shall be maintained and in good repair.

EXTERIOR SURFACE WALLS

Exterior buildings shall be maintained, weather proofed, and properly surface coated where required to prevent deterioration.

ADDRESS IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS

All premises shall be clearly marked with minimum 4 inch high street address numbers visible from the street.

MOTOR VEHICLES

No inoperative or unlicensed motor vehicle shall be parked, kept or stored on any premises and no vehicle shall at any time be in a state of major disassembly, disrepair, or in the process of being stripped or dismantled.

SANITATION

All exterior property and premises shall be maintained in a clean, safe, and sanitary condition.

TIPS FOR POOL SAFETY

Parent safety tips!

Hundreds of young children drown every year in residential swimming pools. These are silent deaths where splashing and screaming to alert a parent or caregiver is unlikely to occur. Owners must construct and maintain barriers that will prevent young children from gaining access to pools. In accordance with the Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code, building and electrical permits are required in addition to rough in and final inspections before any swimming pool, spa, or hot tub can be installed and occupied. This includes inflatable, above ground, and in ground pools.

Building Regulations

- ☑ All doors and windows providing direct access from the home to the pool must be equipped with an exit alarm.
- ☑ All doors providing direct access from the home to the pool must be equipped with a self-closing, self-latching device with a release mechanism placed no lower than 54 inches above the floor.
- ☑ Gates that provide access to swimming pools must open outward away from the pool and be self-closing and equipped with a self-latching locking device. The release mechanism must be located on the pool side of the gate and placed so that it cannot be reached by a young child over the top or through any opening gap.
- ☑ The barrier may not have any gaps, openings, indentations, protrusions, or structural components that could allow a young child to crawl under, squeeze through, or climb over the barrier.
- ☑ The barrier must be at least four feet high on the outside.
- ☑ The barrier must be placed around the perimeter of the pool and be separate from any fence, wall, or other enclosure surrounding the yard. This is unless the fence, wall, or other enclosure is situated on the perimeter of the pool and is being used as part of the barrier and meets the barrier requirements listed.
- ☑ The structure of an above ground swimming pool may be used as its barrier or the barrier for such a pool may be mounted on top of its structure; however, such structure or separately mounted barrier must meet all barrier requirements listed. In addition, any ladder or steps that are the means of access to an above ground pool must be capable of being secured, locked, or removed to prevent access or must be surrounded by a barrier that meets the requirements of this section.
- ☑ A wall of a dwelling may serve as part of the barrier if it does not contain any door or window that opens to provide access to the swimming pool.
- ☑ Pools must have an entrapment prevention system. Anti-entrapment drain covers and fittings help prevent body or hair entrapment.

Parent safety tips!

Parents and caregivers must never leave a child alone or out of sight in or near the pool, spa, or hot tub – not even for a second. Most childhood drowning deaths occur when the parent or caregiver becomes distracted by the telephone, doorbell, or chore around the home. Contact 911 immediately if an emergency should occur. Parents and caregivers are encouraged to become trained in CPR and to enroll their child, ages 4+, in swim lessons. Children should wear arm floaties or inflatable vests while in the water for extra protection; remember, these are not life jackets and should never be substituted for adult supervision.

Any resident interested in constructing a pool, spa, or hot tub in their yard may contact the Moon Township Administration Office at 412-262-1700 with any questions. Building and electrical permits are required for all swimming pools that are designed to hold 24" or more of water, including storable or inflatable swimming pools. Check with the Moon Township Administration Office and obtain a permit before buying a swimming pool.

IMPORTANT TAX REMINDERS

By PA Local Property Tax Collection Law, municipal property tax statements are not permitted to be accepted in partial payments, my office must return any partial payments, including payments submitted after a collection period has ended and the payment was not postmarked. We can only apply payments in the full amount of the payment period received or postmarked.

Only Moon Area School District Property taxes are permitted by law to be paid in 4 installments, the first payment of the exact amount on the tax statement is due no later than August 31 or postmarked to be eligible to pay in the installment plan.

The year property tax statements are mailed, regardless which tax it covers, is not considered delinquent until the following calendar year. This includes special taxes such as interims for prior tax years on new homes or additions. My office sends reminder notices simply to alert the property owner and possibly save additional costs and fees that are typically incurred once a property tax becomes delinquent.

If a property owner receives a letter from Allegheny County showing an increase in

their assessment value, depending on when the increase occurred during a calendar year, this parcel might require an “additional” tax payment amount to satisfy the full amount of the property tax that is due. My office only sends additional tax statements and interim billings to the homeowner, not all mortgage companies acknowledge these statements and in many cases the property owner may not wish to have it paid from their escrow. If you receive notification from the county for an increase in your assessment value, contact my office if you have any questions.

***All property owners in Moon Township should contact the Moon tax office and Allegheny County Treasurer John Weinstein, 412.350.4100, if there has been a change in ownership, mailing address, mortgage or escrow to ensure that they will receive a bill in the mail. My office does not typically receive updates on changes. Pennsylvania law states that regardless if a property owner receives a bill in the mail; they are still responsible for payment of their property taxes.

2015 Moon Area School tax information at a glance:

The Moon Area School District property tax statements will be mailed on July 1, 2015. The school district property taxes follow a fiscal year, July 1st through June 30th of the following calendar year. However, all property taxes must be paid in the calendar year they are billed, otherwise they will be considered delinquent. Please check my website for the 2015 MASD millage rate, (the information was not available at the time of printing) and ACT 1/ homestead reduction amount if applicable. The amount of the MASD homestead reduction is listed on your tax statements. In order to calculate the amount of your property taxes, always start with the full assessment value. If you qualify, deduct the homestead or senior discounts. Using this figure, multiply by the township or school millage rate to get the Face or full amount of the property tax and reduce by 2% if paid during the discount period or increase by 10% if paid during the penalty period.

2015 MASD DUE DATES

2% discount/begin installment plan:

July 1 to August 31

Face (full amount):

September 1 to October 31

10% Penalty:

November 1 to December 31, 2015.
